



PHILLIP NOEL HARTLEY SMITH DISTINGUISHED HONOURS SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2005 the Phillip Noel Hartley Smith Scholarship is funded by donations from Dr Phillip Noel Hartley Smith and the Faculty of Economics and Business. The scholarship is intended to encourage the study of business ethics or business history at the honours level and is valued at \$6000. It is open to candidates enrolled in an undergraduate degree with the Faculty of Economics and Business, who are commencing their honours year and can demonstrate for their thesis proposal a focus on 'business ethics' or 'business history'.

1. Please attach a typewritten summary (one-two pages only) on your proposed dissertation topic focusing on either 'business ethics' or 'business history'. Please note the relevance of your proposal to either business ethics OR business history must be demonstrated in your summary.
2. Please reference which topic you are focusing upon, either Business ethics OR Business history in the subtitle of your heading.
 - a. Examples of 'Business ethics' topics could include, but are not limited to: *Accounting profession and ethics; finance and accounting regulation and ethics; business governance and ethics; ethical issues in international business.*
 - b. Examples of 'Business history' topics could include, but are not limited to: *International corporate investment in Australia; corporate case studies; Australian corporate investment off-shore; longitudinal studies of national and multi-national industries.*

You may also include points of reference i.e. texts.

Section 3. Academic Record and Other Attachments.

The faculty office will attach a copy of your academic transcript for you if you have completed your undergraduate coursework at The University of Sydney.

Students undertaking their honours year at The University of Sydney, after completing an undergraduate pass degree from another institution, should provide an original academic transcript or copy certified by a Justice of the Peace.

You are welcome to attach two additional pages of supporting documents, such as your CV, work experience, awards etc.

FACULTY OF ECONOMICS AND BUSINESS

Conditions of Award 2010

1. The scholarship shall be titled the 'Phillip Noel Hartley Smith Distinguished Honours Scholarship'.
2. The scholarship is valued at \$6,000 payable as a one-off payment at the commencement of the honours year.
3. The tenure of the scholarship is one year.
4. The scholarship holder is required to undertake their honours year in full-time study.
5. The Faculty of Economics and Business will award the scholarship, on academic merit, to an honours student of the faculty whose dissertation topic focuses on business ethics or business history.
6. The scholarship is awarded on the recommendation of the relevant Chairs of Discipline who may assess the topics of business ethics or business history and by the Dean, Faculty of Economics and Business.
7. If the holder of the scholarship withdraws from his/her honours year he/she is liable to return the funding for the award.
8. The scholarships may not be awarded to an applicant who is already in receipt of an honours scholarship or another award of equal or higher value.
